## 1<sup>st</sup> Scripture Reading: 1 Timothy 1:12-17 (NKJV)

And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord who has enabled me, because He counted me faithful, putting *me* into the ministry, <sup>13</sup> although I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and an <sup>[a]</sup>insolent man; but I obtained mercy because I did *it* ignorantly in unbelief. <sup>14</sup> And the grace of our Lord was exceedingly abundant, with faith and love which are in Christ Jesus. <sup>15</sup> This *is* a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief. <sup>16</sup> However, for this reason I obtained mercy, that in me first Jesus Christ might show all longsuffering, as a pattern to those who are going to believe on Him for everlasting life. <sup>17</sup> Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, to <sup>[b]</sup>God who alone is wise, *be* honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Scripture Reading: Luke 13:1-9 (NKJV)

13 There were present at that season some who told Him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had <sup>[a]</sup>mingled with their sacrifices. <sup>2</sup> And Jesus answered and said to them, "Do you suppose that these Galileans were worse sinners than all *other* Galileans, because they suffered such things? <sup>3</sup> I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish. <sup>4</sup> Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them, do you think that they were worse sinners than all *other* men who dwelt in Jerusalem? <sup>5</sup> I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish."

<sup>6</sup> He also spoke this parable: "A certain *man* had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. <sup>7</sup> Then he said to the keeper of his vineyard, 'Look, for three years I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree and find none. Cut it down; why does it <sup>[b]</sup> use up the ground?' <sup>8</sup> But he answered and said to him, 'Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and fertilize *it*. <sup>9</sup> <sup>[c]</sup> And if it bears fruit, *well*. But if not, after that you can cut it down.'"
