### 1<sup>st</sup> Scripture Reading: Hebrews 3:1-6 (NKJV)

Therefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession, Christ Jesus,<sup>2</sup> who was faithful to Him who appointed Him, as Moses also *was faithful* in all His house.<sup>3</sup> For this One has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses, inasmuch as He who built the house has more honor than the house.<sup>4</sup> For every house is built by someone, but He who built all things *is* God.<sup>5</sup> And Moses indeed *was faithful* in all His house as a servant, for a testimony of those things which would be spoken *afterward*,<sup>6</sup> but Christ as a Son over His own house, whose house we are if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope <sup>[a]</sup>firm to the end.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Scripture Reading: Luke 18:18-30 (NKJV)

<sup>18</sup> Now a certain ruler asked Him, saying, “Good Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?”

<sup>19</sup> So Jesus said to him, “Why do you call Me good? No one *is* good but One, *that is*, God.<sup>20</sup> You know the commandments: ‘Do not commit adultery,’ ‘Do not murder,’ ‘Do not steal,’ ‘Do not bear false witness,’ ‘Honor your father and your mother.’ ”

<sup>21</sup> And he said, “All these things I have kept from my youth.”

<sup>22</sup> So when Jesus heard these things, He said to him, “You still lack one thing. Sell all that you have and distribute to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me.”

<sup>23</sup> But when he heard this, he became very sorrowful, for he was very rich.

<sup>24</sup> And when Jesus saw that he became very sorrowful, He said, “How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!<sup>25</sup> For it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.”

<sup>26</sup> And those who heard it said, “Who then can be saved?”

<sup>27</sup> But He said, “The things which are impossible with men are possible with God.”

<sup>28</sup> Then Peter said, “See, we have left <sup>[a]</sup>all and followed You.”

<sup>29</sup> So He said to them, “Assuredly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or parents or brothers or wife or children, for the sake of the kingdom of God,<sup>30</sup> who shall not receive many times more in this present time, and in the age to come eternal life.”
