FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

One hundred ninety-four years ago this church started from an inspired dream held by only a handful of people. With much prayer, hard work and financial sacrifice, as the LeRoy economy and population grew, those few people grew this church from nothing into one of the most influential churches in the Western New York Conference of The Methodist Church. Annual Conference was held at this church. At this church, B.T. Roberts, the name sake and primary driving force behind Roberts Wesleyan College, received life-changing inspiration. This church grew from infancy, to youth, to flourishing maturity, and then, like the population and economy of LeRoy, it has diminished until it once again numbers a handful of people.

Nevertheless, we've seen what a handful of dedicated people can do! Are we the remnant whom God has left here to restart this church's cycle of life? Do we have the Holy Spirit inspired dream in our hearts to do it? Or, is it possible that we are the group that is going to celebrate the magnificent history of this church and keep it alive as long as we can in order to bask in its beauty, spread the Gospel to anyone who will listen, and praise God for the privilege? Considering our dream, our resources, and God's providence and sovereignty, which path is ours? Both choices are God honoring! Which will it be?

Genesee Valley Civil War Round Table


On Wednesday, March 15th, the Genesee Valley Civil War Round Table will resume for the season!
