⁵ Now a certain man was there who had an infirmity thirty-eight years. ⁶ When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he already had been *in that condition* a long time, He said to him, "Do you want to be made well?" ⁷ The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me." ⁸ Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." ⁹ And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked. And that day was the Sabbath." (NKJV).

In this story, we see the conditions under which Jesus' power operates, he commanded and to the extent that they obeyed him, power acted on people. It is amazing that this man had been 38 years in that condition, and nobody helped

him. The conviction of waiting for the movement of the water to get into the pond and being healed impressed Jesus, so he asks the man: Do you want to be made well? Instead of answering the question, the man begins to make excuses and put his responsibility on other people. That often happens nowadays with many Christians.

The first condition for a person to receive the power of God is to want it intensely. Today, Jesus may be asking us: are you sure you want to do what God has called you to do? If in the depths of our hearts we are satisfied with our current situation, then there will be no change. We will continue with our course.

In this case, Jesus approaches this man to tell him to get up, this was a way to move this man's will to make an effort. The impossible happen when our will moves to do what God wants us to do. This man made the effort to get up when Jesus told him and the impossible happened.

If we believe that we can do this project together, even when it seems impossible, you will see the power of God operating in our lives and in our church. All we need to do is get up and move to see the impossible for us, made possible by God. Let's get up and move forward because the Lord is with us. And that is what He wants from us.




Worship

The drawing will hang in the Woodward Memorial Library.

It is a drawing of the Copper Beech Tree that used to stand in front of the School/Library on Wolcott St.

An English (Copper) Beech grows in front of the Woodward Memorial Library. The tree arrived in Le Roy in 1930. When it was planted it was already 37 years old. The Woodward children had the tree transplanted and brought into the community. The tree became known as "The Library Tree." Former library director, the late Gerald Halligan, wrote a poem in honor of the tree.

How many lives deemed successful were greened in this tree of life?

Climbing legs twist to hug the skyward limb and find a strength before unknown.
