

STANDING FIRM IN ADVERSITY

Nehemiah 4: 1-10



God's call to Nehemiah was not easy, as he would have to face enemies that opposed the reconstruction of Jerusalem, in addition to the discouragement of a people who had lost everything, because they only said: "the rubble is much and we cannot build the wall". But when a man/woman accepts God's challenge, [s]he is able to motivate himself/herself and motivate others to fulfill God's purposes. This motivation must begin with a sincere and specific prayer about the need to see the glory of God.

Believers are called to fight against internal and external enemies, which prevent us from building a solid spiritual life. We are builders and cannot allow sin and bad habits, such as indifference, apathy, laziness, sinful pleasure, materialism, and worldliness to prevent edification of our spiritual life. We must remove the rubble and take out the garbage so that our service to the Lord is not ineffective. The external enemies are the people who, like Sanballat and Tobiah, used anger, fear and mockery to try to dissuade the Jews from building the wall. These are the people who discourage us from following God.

Nehemiah ignored them and instead prayed, and the work continued. When they make fun of us for our faith or criticize us for serving God and doing the right thing, let us do the same thing that Nehemiah did and don't be discouraged. Let us express to God what we are feeling and remember that his constant presence gives us the strength to continue.

Let the Lord be the foundation of our life, our rock on which we must anchor, to be strong. (Portion taken from "Conexion de Vida")

Your Worship Team, along with your Trustees, has made the decision to move our worship services into the Great Room


for the winter heating season. This should help immensely with the cost of heating our church. Beginning on December 1st, ALL services will be held in the Great Room until spring.


