Pray Without Fainting

1 Thessalonians 5:17

Jesus spoke with authority, gave his commandments to men/women, and as they obeyed, they saw God's hand work miracles. In John Chapter 5, when Jesus asks a man if he wanted to be cured, it seems that it was a question that did not make any sense. Who does not want to be healed? This man had waited for thirty-eight years and perhaps he had already lost hope, it is even possible that in the most intimate part of his heart he was satisfied to remain as we was, because, if he was cured, he would have to face the weight of his life and its responsibilities. But this man's response was immediate. He wanted to be healed, although he didn't see how, since there was no one to help him.

Today, this situation is also presented to us, because Jesus comes and asks us: "Do you really want Me in your life? Do you really want to change?" If in the innermost part of our heart we are happy to be as we are, we don't need Jesus in our life, or there can be no change, because the desire to divine things must inflame our heart. Jesus, then, told the man to stand up, for it is as if he had said: "Man, bend your will! Make a supreme effort and you and I will achieve it together." The power of God does not disregard the effort of the man/woman.

No man/woman can sit and wait for the miracle to happen. The miracle happens when our will and the power of God cooperate to make it possible. "Get up," he said. Certainly, Jesus was ordering the man to try the impossible. The man could have said that, that was exactly what he could not do, that for thirty-eight years the bed had been his support. But once again, man made the effort alongside Jesus, and the miracle happened.

Here, we have the way to achieve what we long for. There are so many things in this world that overcome us, defeat us and seize us, but the effort and faith in Christ will manifest His power and the miracle will happen.

All this happens when we have an encounter with the Lord, and we obey what He wants us to do, then we will see God's hand acting in our life. During our 40-day circle of prayer, we have to make as a supreme effort as the man who was sick for thirty-eight years. God told Joshua: "I've commanded you to be strong and brave" (Joshua 1:9).

These are times where we are going through extremely difficult times, the best we can do is pray. Praying without fainting, with thanksgiving, having in our mind every promise, where God promises protection (Psalm 91), helps in difficult times (Psalm 46: 1), blessing and directing our decisions (Psalm 25).

Likewise, we should be praying for our spouse, children, family, friends, our church, our community, and our leaders to prosper in all things, just as their soul prospers (3 John Verse 2) and increases their knowledge of Christ (2 Peter 3:18), because it is the guarantee that we will all reach maturity to keep us stable, reaffirmed and with great blessing, in all areas of life (1 Thessalonians 5:23).

Stand up and join our 40-day prayer circle. Stand up and listen to the voice of the Lord so that you can see the miracles of God in your life. (Portion taken from "Conexion de Vida").


