**Today's Scripture Readings -- August 30, 2020**

**Luke 14:1, 7-14 (NKJV)**

**A Man with Dropsy Healed on the Sabbath**

**14** Now it happened, as He went into the house of one of the rulers of the Pharisees to eat bread on the Sabbath, that they watched Him closely.

**Take the Lowly Place**

<sup>7</sup> So He told a parable to those who were invited, when He noted how they chose the best places, saying to them: <sup>8</sup> "When you are invited by anyone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in the best place, lest one more honorable than you be invited by him; <sup>9</sup> and he who invited you and him come and say to you, 'Give place to this man,' and then you begin with shame to take the lowest place. <sup>10</sup> But when you are invited, go and sit down in the lowest place, so that when he who invited you comes he may say to you, 'Friend, go up higher.' Then you will have glory in the presence of those who sit at the table with you. <sup>11</sup> For whoever exalts himself will be <sup>[a]</sup>humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

<sup>12</sup> Then He also said to him who invited Him, "When you give a dinner or a supper, do not ask your friends, your brothers, your relatives, nor rich neighbors, lest they also invite you back, and you be repaid. <sup>13</sup> But when you give a feast, invite *the poor, the* <sup>[b]</sup>maimed, *the lame, the blind.* <sup>14</sup> And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you; for you shall be repaid at the resurrection of the just."

**Second Scripture Reading:**

**Jeremiah 2:4-10 (NKJV)**

<sup>4</sup> Hear the word of the LORD, O house of Jacob and all the families of the house of Israel. <sup>5</sup> Thus says the LORD:

"What injustice have your fathers found in Me,  
That they have gone far from Me,  
Have followed <sup>[a]</sup>idols,  
And have become idolaters?

<sup>6</sup> Neither did they say, 'Where *is* the LORD,

Who brought us up out of the land of Egypt,  
Who led us through the wilderness,  
Through a land of deserts and pits,  
Through a land of drought and the shadow of death,  
Through a land that no one crossed  
And where no one dwelt?'

<sup>7</sup> I brought you into a bountiful country,  
To eat its fruit and its goodness.

But when you entered, you defiled My land  
And made My heritage an abomination.

<sup>8</sup> The priests did not say, 'Where *is* the LORD?'  
And those who handle the law did not know Me;  
The rulers also transgressed against Me;  
The prophets prophesied by Baal,  
And walked after *things that* do not profit.

<sup>9</sup> "Therefore I will yet <sup>[b]</sup>bring charges against you," says the LORD,  
"And against your children's children I will bring charges.

<sup>10</sup> For pass beyond the coasts of <sup>[c]</sup>Cyprus and see,  
Send to <sup>[d]</sup>Kedar and consider diligently,  
And see if there has been such *a thing*.
